Summer Reading and Math

MATH- Please review the addition and subtraction facts up to 20. You can make or buy flashcards to review these facts for five to ten minutes daily. There will be timed tests on these facts the first few weeks of school. No more relying on fingers to get an answer in third grade. There are many educational sites to help with practice, such as www.alusmath.com or www.sheppardssoftware.com. A summer math skills review packet also needs to be completed before school starts. One sheet for July and one for August.

READING- Read 1 chapter books this summer. Please help your child chose a book they are able to read and excited to share with you. You may read this together or have your child read it aloud to you over the summer. Please complete the book report found in the packet once the chapter book is read. Daily reading should continue after your child completes the book report. This will help with comprehension, fluency, and developing the habit of reading every day. Graphic novels, nonfiction, magazines or short stories all "count" as daily reading too!
